

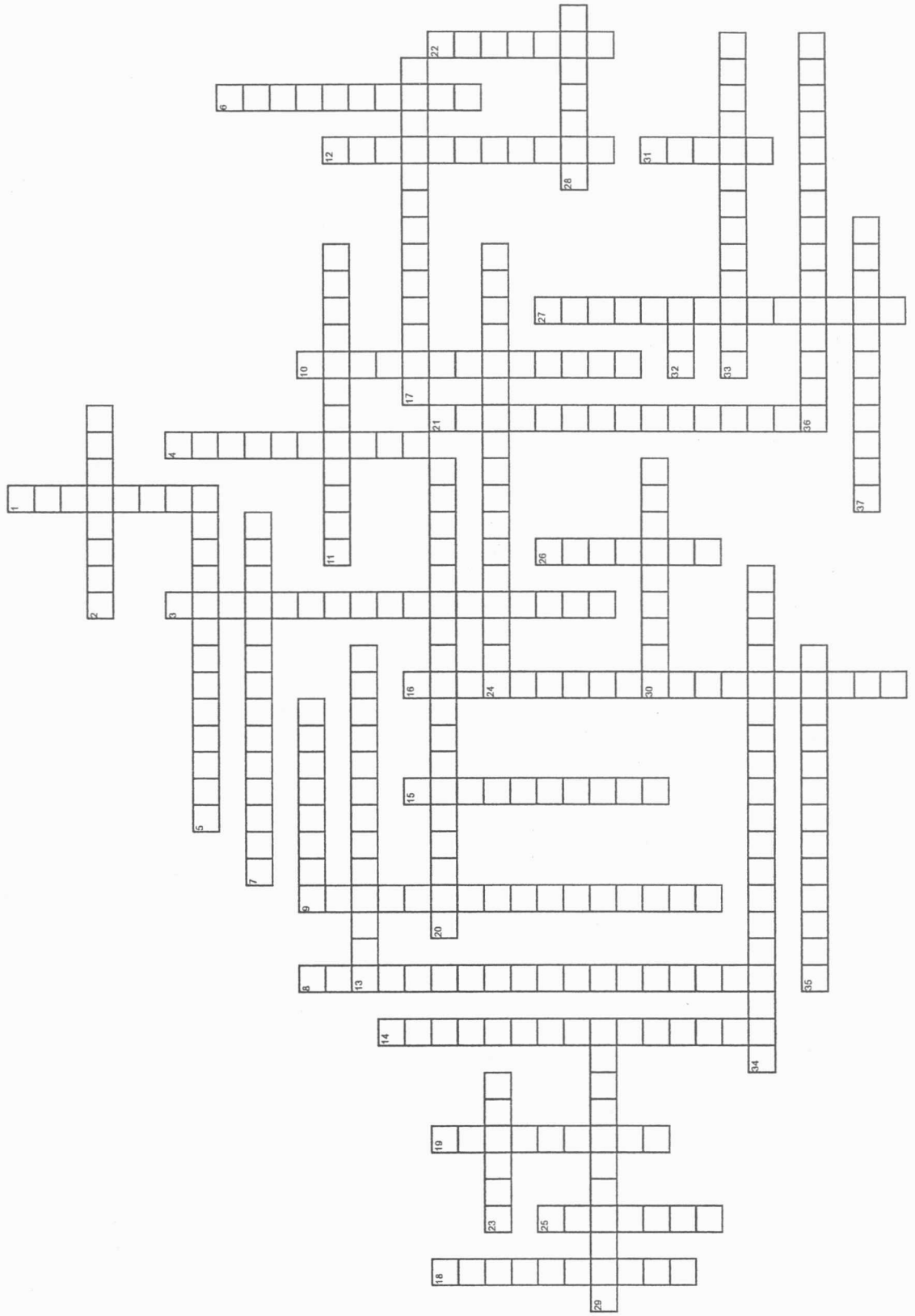
## ACROSS

- 2 Meetings of party leaders to determine party policy or to choose the party's candidate for public office
- 5 The political party that has fewer members in Congress or in a state legislatures
- 7 The process of drawing of congressional district lines to favor a political party
- 9 Meetings of Congress
- 11 People represented by members of a lawmaking body
- 13 Powers not specifically granted to Congress by the Constitution that are suggested to be necessary to carry out the powers delegated to Congress under the Constitution
- 17 A vote in Congress in which a record is made of how each member votes
- 20 Permanent House or Senate committees that consider bills in a certain area
- 23 The minimum number of members who must be present before a legislative body can conduct business
- 24 The right of members of Congress to mail official letters free of charge
- 28 The formal disapproval of the actions of a member of Congress by the other members
- 29 A formal charge brought against a government official
- 30 The removal of a person from an institution, such as Congress, for serious misconduct
- 32 A law
- 33 Article 1, section 8, of the Constitution; known also as the "necessary and proper" clause that allows Congress to extend its delegated powers
- 34 The official who presides over the Senate in the vice-president's absence
- 35 The political party that has more members in Congress or in a state legislatures
- 36 The custom of giving leadership of committees to members of Congress with the most years of service
- 37 A political party leader in Congress who works for the passage of bills that the party favors

- 4 Small groups in Congress formed to consider bills
- 6 A means by which the president can reject a bill, when Congress is not in session, by not signing it
- 8 A court order requiring that an accused person be brought to court to determine if there is enough evidence to hold the person for trial
- 9 Temporary House or Senate committees appointed to deal with issues not handled by standing committees
- 10 Divisions of standing congressional committees that deal with specific issues in the area handled by their primary committees

- 15 A method of delaying action on a bill in the Senate by making long speeches
- 16 Temporary congressional committees made up of senators and representatives who try to reach an agreement on different versions of a bill

- 19 The assistant to the floor leader in each house of Congress who tries to persuade party members to vote for bills that the party supports
- 21 Committees made up of members of both houses of Congress to deal with matters of mutual concern
- 22 A limit on the debate of a bill in the Senate
- 25 The presiding officer of the House of Representatives
- 26 An act that betrays and endangers one's country
- 27 A law that applies to an action that took place before the law was passed
- 31 Proposed laws being considered by a lawmaking body
